


## Bamboo in South East Asia


In Asia, the major bamboo producing countries are India (almost 11.4 million hectares) and China (over 5.4 million hectares), followed by Indonesia (2 million hectares) and the Lao People's Democratic Republic (1.6 million hectares). Source : FAO 2005




# Potential of Bamboo in SEA

- Fast regeneration
- Large area of natural bamboo forest
- Est. Of 1,5 millions hectares of natural bamboo forest
- Large number of bamboo species
  50 species within 30 species are traded
  - Large range of use and utilisation




## Situation in SEA

- Rural and poor population Generating 4 millions usd in 2011
  - Risk of deforestation
  - The « open market » pressuring the small scale farmers:
    - Pressure on quick change of farming system
    - Pressure on Land
    - Need on Diversification/ agro ecology
- Bamboo as a window to work on land and forest land right and income diversification



# Bamboo an opportunity for communities to:

- Pro poor value chain development to reduce poverty
- Resilience of the rural population
- Forest and environment protection
- Develop other NTFP opportunities based on experiences
- contributor to climate change (environment value and economical value)



## Advantages of Bamboo

Bamboo markets is considered as "an increasingly important economic asset in poverty eradication and economic and environmental development" (FAO, 2005).
