

- Working towards resilient ecosystems for resilient communities





- involving community members in protected area manage



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

Organic Inspection Certification

Previous WCS mapping and monitoring has allowed us to gain ad-hoc certification

Certification with previous compliance accepted as three years transition. 40% this year

Farmers must have been 'Wildlife Friendly for 3 years, Organic allows us to pay a further 20% farmer premium

- Inform v2 of SRP Standards and Indicators
- Incorporate biodiversity in v2
- Introduce principles of soil conservation and reduced inputs to improve sustainability
- Potential to have impact over large area
