Pathway N2	Limited <b>technical capacity</b> of FOs, technicians on AE, SF and <b>increasing trend</b> of AE/SF products due to <b>health and safety concerns</b>
Pathway N3	Poor management of agricultural <b>chemical use</b>

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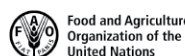
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
